Federated Church began as a “federation” or combination of two congregations each with its own denominational heritage, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the American Baptists.

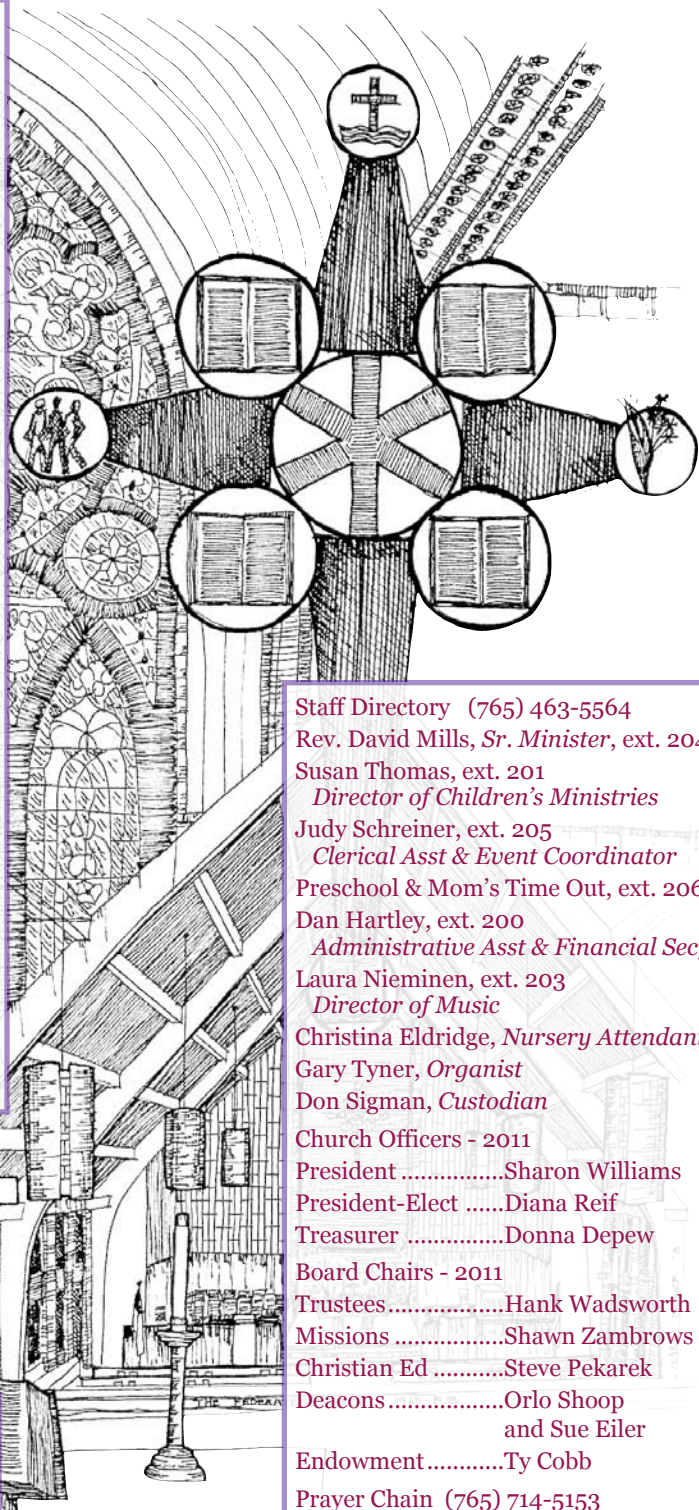
Today, it has grown to be an exciting and dynamic church of more than 240 families from 34 Christian faith traditions.

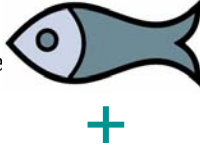

## Hearthside Gathering, Limerick the Tenth

When on earth seeking heaven makes sense  
Indeed, leaving paradise for here sounds rather dense.

For ten weeks those gathered around the hearth have been singing “I Feel the Winds of God Today,” a great old hymn that invokes pilgrimage by sea as a metaphor for seeking God’s presence in life. We knew for certain this week that we had become very good at singing it because, even though Laura couldn’t be with us, we managed to sing all four verses fairly respectably (perhaps we can interest The Chieftains or The Dropkick Murphy’s in making room for us on their next album?). This week we also learned that our favorite sea-faring saint, having made a seven year voyage to paradise, no more than arrives than he is ready to go home to medieval Erin (a.k.a. Ireland). Does this make any sense to you? Would you, having finally stepped into God’s presence, a place which scripture describes in the most grandiloquent of terms, wish to return to the life you are living now? The truth is that most of us are much more comfortable singing “When we All Get to Heaven” or “I’ll Fly Away” than the Brendenesque “I Feel the Winds of God Today”. We want to leave the imperfect and go to the perfect. Why would Brendan, or anyone else for that matter, having stepped foot in the land of the perfect, want to go anywhere else?

If Brendan’s choosing Erin over angels sounds odd  
Then think about the Christ sent to us by God  
To redeem all rather than whitewash the Platonic fence

So what’s up? Actually, the reason why we find Brendan’s behavior so peculiar lies in that question. Most of us think in vertical terms when it comes to God. God is up and the devil is down. Heaven is above and Hell is below. Plato’s distinction, or fence, between spirit and matter, which is a piece of the Greco-Roman world’s cultural baggage, is once again making fools of us. The Celtic Christians, who lived outside of the borders of Greco-Roman culture, did not think in these terms. They were accustomed to praying St. Patrick’s Breastplate (which is invoked every Sunday at Federated in the benediction, “Christ be before me. Christ be behind me”...you know the rest), which speaks not of the hereafter but of the here-and now. Here a bit of the Breastplate. See for yourself.

*I bind unto myself today / The virtues of the starlit heaven,  
The glorious sun's life-giving ray, / The whiteness of the moon at even,  
The flashing of the lightning free, / The whirling wind's tempestuous shocks,  
The stable earth, the deep salt sea, / Around the old eternal rocks.*

Starlight, sunlight, moonlight, lightning, the wind, the earth, the ocean, and even the rocks picked out the freshly-plowed fields all praise their maker (remember how in Genesis God keeps pausing in the act of creation to muse at how “good” everything is?) You are reading this on Easter Sunday, right? Easter is not a tale of how God rejects life-as-it-is (i.e. the crucifixion), but rather the story of how God comes to revitalize it (i.e. the resurrection). The point of redemption isn’t to be in this life in lieu of another but to join God in renewing, refinishing, and recycling this one. This is why God got all dressed up in flesh and blood and, as Jesus, joined us in this life. This is also why Brendan sails home to Ireland. The saint understands that instead of cooling his heels in the paradise of the saints, God is waiting for him at home to join in the work of redeeming medieval Irish culture. Do we understand God so well? Ah now, that is the question! Do we “Feel the Winds of God Today” blowing through the labs and classrooms, local businesses, our families, the choices being made by our elected officials, and yes, our own souls? If you do, then you truly have something sing about.

## Bill of Fare

### 1/2 Shepherd's Pie 4.99

A half-order of shepherd's pie, topped with mashed potatoes and cheese. Think of this dish as the best a pot pie you'll ever have. It's loaded with savory meats and topped, not, à la Marie Callendar, with a "cheesy" pastry crust, but with inches of cheese-laced mashed spuds.

### 1/2 Fish and Chips 7.99

Lightly battered whitefish and a side of pub chips. Lois says it's cooked in the "right oil;" David says "a half order is all anyone can eat so don't worry about going hungry." The three cats who are members of Clan Mills say, "God bless you our newest and dearest friend."

### 1/2 Corned Beef & Cabbage 4.99

Slow-cooked corned beef, steamed cabbage. He may have been raised as a Lutheran but Ralph Webb's "Celtic heritage" shines brightly in his devotion to this dish. Or are the "shiny bits" just his ankles peeping out of his iron age socks? You be the judge.

### 1/2 Guinness Stew 4.99

A half-order of our slow simmered beef stew, made with Guinness Stout and Angus pot roast. It is an established fact that Arthur Guinness delightful beverage has fewer carbohydrates than any beer on the market (Guinness Stout is so healthful that nineteenth century pediatricians prescribed it for nursing mothers, hence the traditional toast "To those newly and long weaned!"). By being slow cooked with the pot roast it adds a rich complex flavor and is rendered alcohol free (teetotalers, you can eat this and look your WCTU friends in the face on the morrow).
